7 RV Resort at Cannon Beach      **9**

This private resort is located about seven blocks from one of the nicest beaches in the region. From the town of Cannon Beach you can walk for miles in either direction. Ecola State Park is just two miles north. Nearby recreational facilities include marked bike trails, a riding stable, and tennis courts.



Location: Near Ecola State Park; map C1, grid b6.

Campsites, facilities: There are 100 sites for trailers or RVs of any length; 11 are drive-through sites. Electricity, drinking water, sewer hookups, and picnic tables are provided. Flush toilets, bottled gas, showers, firewood, a recreation hall, a store, a spa, a laundry room, ice, a playground, and a swimming pool are available. Leashed pets are permitted.

Reservations, fees: Reservations accepted. Sites are \$23-34 per night. Open year-round.

Directions: From Portland on Interstate 5, turn west on U.S. 26 and drive 73 miles to the junction with U.S. 101. Turn south on U.S. 101 and drive four miles to the Cannon Beach exit at Milepost 29.5. Turn left (east) and drive 200 feet to the campground.

8 Saddle Mountain State Park   **7**

This is a good alternative to the many beachfront parks to the south. A 2.5-mile trail climbs to the top of Saddle Mountain, a great lookout on clear days. This park is a real find for the naturalist interested in rare and unusual varieties of plants, many of which have established themselves along the slopes of this isolated mountain.

Location: On Saddle Mountain; map C1, grid b7.

Campsites, facilities: There are 10 primitive tent sites. Drinking water, garbage bins, picnic tables, and fire grills are provided. Flush toilets and firewood are available. Leashed pets are permitted.

Reservations, fees: No reservations accepted. Sites are \$7-10 per night, \$7 for an additional vehicle. Open March through October.

Directions: From Portland turn west on U.S. 26 and drive about 63 miles to Necanicum Junction and Saddle Mountain Road. Turn north on Saddle Mountain Road and drive eight miles to the park.

9 Nehalem Bay State Park         **7**
